## LATEX ALLERGIES

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), Centers for Disease Control, has issued the following warning:

WORKERS EXPOSED TO LATEX GLOVES AND OTHER PRODUCTS CONTAINING NATURAL RUBBER LATEX MAY DEVELOP ALLERGIC REACTIONS SUCH AS SKIN RASHES; HIVES; NASAL, EYE, OR SINUS SYMPTOMS; ASTHMA; AND (RARELY) SHOCK

Reports of allergic reactions to latex products have recently increased, especially among health care workers.

## NIOSH has developed the following recommendations to help prevent latex allergies.

- Employers
  - o Provide non-latex gloves for employees.
  - o If barrier protection is needed, i.e. handling infectious materials provide reduced protein, powder-free gloves.
  - o Provide education programs for workers about latex allergies.
  - o Periodically screen high risk employees for symptoms.
- Employees
  - o Use non-latex gloves for noninfectious tasks.
  - o If needed for barrier protection from infectious materials, use reduced protein, powder-free gloves
  - o Wash hands after latex glove use.
  - o Good Housekeeping Remove latex-containing dust from the workplace.
  - o Familiarize with procedures for preventing latex allergies.
  - o Recognize symptoms of latex allergy
